Photovoltaic mounting systems (also called solar module racking) are used to fix solar panels on surfaces like roofs, building facades, or the ground. [1] These mounting systems generally enable retrofitting of solar panels on roofs or as part of the structure of the building (called BIPV). [2]

This racking system may be used to ground and/or mount a PV module complying with UL 1703 only when the specific module has been evaluated for grounding and/or mounting in compliance with the included instructions. The system is a non-separately derived system.

What is the export limitation for a SolarEdge inverter?

To use export limitation, the inverter/Commercial Gateway communication board firmware (CPU) version must be 2.8xx/3.8xx or higher. If the CPU version is lower, contact SolarEdge support for an upgrade file and instructions (support@solaredge.com).

How do I install a meter bracket?

1. Install the bracket with the semi-circles facing down, as shown below. Verify that the bracket is firmly attached to the mounting surface. If you are connecting the meter to a revenue grade inverter, refer to Installing Two Meters on page 19.
