

# Monocrystalline silicon for photovoltaic panels in the north

Why is monocrystalline silicon used in solar panels?

Monocrystalline silicon is used to manufacture high-performance photovoltaic panels. The quality requirements for monocrystalline solar panels are not very demanding. In this type of boards the demands on structural imperfections are less high compared to microelectronics applications. For this reason, lower quality silicon is used.

What is monocrystalline silicon used for?

Monocrystalline silicon is the base material for silicon chips used in virtually all electronic equipment today. In the field of solar energy, monocrystalline silicon is also used to make photovoltaic cells due to its ability to absorb radiation.

Why are crystalline silicon based solar cells dominating the global solar PV market?

Currently, the crystalline silicon (c-Si)-based solar cells are still dominating the global solar PV market because of their abundance, stability, and non-toxicity. <sup>1,2</sup> However, the conversion efficiency of PV cells is constrained by the spectral mismatch losses, non-radiative recombination and strong thermalisation of charge carriers.

How are monocrystalline solar cells made?

Monocrystalline solar cells are produced from pseudo-square silicon wafer substrates cut from column ingots grown by the Czochralski (CZ) process (see Figure 2). Polycrystalline cells, on the other hand, are made from square silicon substrates cut from polycrystalline ingots grown in quartz crucibles.

How can monocrystalline silicon be prepared?
