How do inverters manage solar power?

Inverters, including those manufactured by SolarEdge, manage solar power by converting DC power from solar panels into AC power that can be used in homes and businesses. To this author's very limited electrical knowledge, all inverter manufacturers use various techniques for this purpose. Solar charge controllers in off-grid systems specifically focus on these designs to keep voltages consistent when charging batteries from variable output solar panels.

What happens if a solar inverter fails?

When one or more inverters fail, multiple PV arrays are disconnected from the grid, significantly reducing the project's profitability. For example, consider a 250-megawatt (MW) solar project, a single 4 MW central inverter failure can lead to a loss of up to 25 MWh/day, or \$1250 a day for a power purchase agreement (PPA) rate of \$50/MWh.

Is SolarEdge infringing on Ampt's patents?

Ampt, a Colorado-based power electronic specialist, has filed a lawsuit against SolarEdge, alleging that all of SolarEdge's technology is in violation of Ampt's patents. The lawsuit asks that SolarEdge be required to immediately cease all sales.

Should SolarEdge be removed from the market?

The lawsuit asks for the removal of SolarEdge's inverter and optimizer lineup from the marketplace due to patent violations. Ampt believes that other manufacturers could replace SolarEdge's hardware if needed.

Can AMPT import SolarEdge power systems?

Ampt filed a complaint with the U.S. International Trade Commission (ITC) against SolarEdge Technologies requesting that the ITC ban the import of SolarEdge power systems and components that infringe Ampt's patents.

Are SolarEdge & AMPT litigating a patent dispute?

SolarEdge and AMPT have been litigating a patent dispute involving a patent family filed by SolarEdge and a patent family filed by AMPT before the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) for many years.
